This marine notice conveste emphasize to the marine industry the importance of EDIPP registration and regular								

This marine notice serves to emphasize to the marine industry the importance of EPIRB registration and regular updating of registered particulars as contained in the Merchant Shipping (EPIRB Registration) Regulations, 2002. Registration of EPIRB's is compulsory whether carried in compliance with statutory requirements or on a voluntarily basis. Hence this registration is an additional requirement in terms of the Merchant Shipping (National Small Vessel Safety) Regulations 2007 – Annexure 2 paragraph 4.

Registration of EPIRB

The owner and operator of every ship of South African Nationality must ensure that every EPIRB carried on the vessel, whether carried due to compliance with statutory requirements or not, is registered with the Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre (MRCC) and that the registered particulars are correct. This Registration Process at the MRCC is a separate process to that of the application for a Maritime Mobile Service Identity Number (MMSI) which is obtained from the Independent Communications Authority of South Africa (ICASA).

A Certificate of Registration of the EPIRB will be provided and must be kept available on -board vessels for inspection at all reasonable times by a surveyor. This certificate shall be renewed annually, in compliance with the Regulations, following the annual confirmation of EPIRB information.

Change in registered particulars

Any change in the particulars registered at the MRCC must be communicated to the MRCC with out delay by using the EPIRB Registration form. A Certificate of Registration of the EPIRB will be provided as proof of the particulars updated.

Deregistration of beacon

Any beacon that is sold, scrapped, damaged beyond further use, permanently removed from service, stolen, or lost must be deregistered by completing the form and ensuring the correct fields are tick and reason for deregistration is clearly indicated.
